Questions and Answers - Payroll UK

Q1. When is the payment date of my wages?

For the monthly (salaried) payroll; the payment file is sent to the bank for payment on the 24th of the month. In case the 24th is a weekend day or Bank Holiday, we aim to send the payment files to the bank for payment on the Friday before.

For the Biweekly payroll, the payment date is every other Friday.

Q2. What is the pay schedule for variable payments?

Sales Commission February, May, August, November CS Incentive January, April, July, September

Annual Salary Review March

YE incentive on March 15 YE CS/ Sales Commission on March 15

Q3. Where can I find an explanation of the different items on the UK pay slip?

Q4. How can I download my pay slip?

Please go to page 6 to find the instruction to download your pay slip from the current payroll system.

Q5. Can I buy or sell holidays?

There is no facility to buy or sell holidays.

Q6. How are bank holiday's calculated in my pay?

Bank holidays are paid at your regular rate. When a bank holiday falls on your parttime day, you are not entitled to a substitute day. If you are scheduled for emergency service on a bank holiday, you are entitled to the weekend rate.

Q7. How is Maternity leave calculated in my pay?

According to UK legislation, you are entitled to Statutory Maternity Pay (SMP) for up to 39 weeks. Your salary is affected as stated below:

- For Biweekly paid employees, your salary is replaced by 100% of your average weekly earnings (before tax) for the first 6 weeks
- For monthly paid employees, your base salary remains unchanged for the first 6 weeks
- After 6 weeks, your salary is replaced by the Statutory Maternity Pay rate or 90% of your weekly earnings (whichever is lower) for the next 33 weeks

SMP is paid in the same way as your wages. Tax and National insurance will be deducted.

There is no difference in these rules for part-time and full-time employees.

a. Will my pension be impacted by the Maternity leave?

No, the pension contribution is not impacted.

b. Will my holidays be impacted by the Maternity leave?

No, the holidays are not impacted and accrued as normal.

c. What happens if I fall ill during my Maternity leave?

There will be no change to your Statutory maternity pay if you are ill whilst on maternity leave.

d. Will I receive emergency call out allowance during my Maternity leave?

No, you are not expected to be available for the emergency call out rota whilst you are on Maternity Leave.

Q8. How is Paternity Pay calculated in my pay?

According to UK legislation, you are entitled to Statutory Paternity Pay (SPP) for 1 week or a block of 2 weeks paid leave. Your salary is affected as stated below:

• your salary is replaced by the Statutory Maternity Pay rate or 90% of your weekly earnings (whichever is lower) for the period you selected as SPP.

SPP is paid in the same way as your wages. Tax and National insurance will be deducted.

There is no difference in these rules for part-time and full-time employees.

a. Will my pension be impacted by the Paternity leave?

No, the pension contribution is not impacted.

b. Will my holiday be impacted by the Paternity leave?

No, the holidays are not impacted and accrued as normal.

c. What happens if I fall ill during my Paternity leave?

There isn't any impact on your paternity leave if you are ill during this leave. If you are unable to return to work after your paternity leave you must follow the sickness notification procedure

d. Will I receive emergency call out allowance during my Paternity leave?

No, you are not expected to be available for the emergency call out rota whilst you are on Paternity Leave.

Q9. How is Sick Leave calculated in my pay?

If you are unable to perform your work due to sickness, accident or medical procedures, your salary payments will be affected. As per UK legislation, you are entitled to Statutory Sick Pay with a waiting period of 3 days.

At Intralox, you receive a supplement on the statutory rate.

- For Biweekly paid employees, the statutory rate is increased to match the National Living Wage for 26 weeks in a rolling 12-month period. Once expired the pay reverts to the Statutory minimum
- For monthly paid employees, statutory rate is increased to match the monthly salary for the first 12 months. Once expired the pay reverts to the Statutory minimum.

Intralox Sick Pay is paid in the same way as your salary. Tax and National insurance will be deducted.

There is no difference in these rules for part-time and full-time employees.

a. Will my pension be impacted by the Sick leave?

No, the pension contribution is not impacted.

b. Will my vacation days be impacted by the Sick leave?

No, the vacation days are not impacted.

c. Will I receive emergency call out allowance during my Sick leave?

No, you are not expected to be available for the emergency call out rota whilst you are on sick Leave


Q10. What is paid in my final pay slip when I leave Intralox?

When you resign from Intralox or you leave Intralox because your current contract ended, you are entitled to your salary up to the last day of the notice period.

If you received a permanent travel advance at the start or during your employment, the amount will be deducted from your last salary payment.

Your untaken accrued vacation days entitlement and holiday allowances will be paid out in the first payroll after the last pay period you received salary payments. Here also the last earned production incentive is paid out.

To keep in line with progress and innovation ADP have updated their payroll platform. This means payslips will be available to view on a secure page using a personal log in and password. Neither HR in the UK or Payroll in Amsterdam will have access to your personal page.

ADP will send 2 emails, one with your link on and one with your password on, they will look like this





If you enter an incorrect password more than 3 times your account will be disabled. Once you have changed your password you will be able to view your payslips on line.





ADP also have a free app in the app store. This can be downloaded to your phone. Using your User ID (email) and password (created by you) you can access your payroll data at he touch of a button 24 hours a day 7 days a week.
